

Registration

There are two ways to register for the Fall 2023 Semester.

Online Classes: A student must register online at www.labts.org for online classes. Several methods of payments are available.

In-person Classes: The registration for in-person classes can be done online at www.labts.org. This is highly recommended. An alternative is to register on the first day of the in-person class. Registration will be held one hour prior to the start of class. Methods of payments that will be accepted are cash, check, and debit/credit card.

Costs: The registration fee is \$100.00 per course. The fee is non-refundable unless the course is cancelled. There is an additional cost for the textbook assigned for each class. The textbook for online classes must be purchased as a part of registration. Students who are taking an in-person class will purchase their textbook on the first day of class.
